Mattress RECYCLING

1. When you purchase a new mattress, ask the local mattress store to recycle your old one; or
2. For home pick-up of an old mattress, without the purchase of a new one, contact a hauler that will recycle your mattress; or
3. Take your mattress to the Citizen's Drop-off area at the County Landfill for a fee or contact 7 Rivers Recycling at 608-783-6727, ext. 103 to find other drop-off locations.

Landfill Fees*

These fees apply to garbage (normal household waste), large items (furniture, toys, bikes, grills, stoves, washers, dryers, and small appliances) and demolition/construction (wood, drywall, doors, flooring, windows, sinks, and roofing). Other materials such as brush, yard waste, tires, microwaves, and Freon containing appliances (air conditioners, dehumidifiers, and refrigerators) have different fees. 
Only people authorized by site attendants may utilize the landfill facility. You must provide your own labor for unloading materials. Due to safety concerns, we do not permit salvaging once waste is placed into containers.

* PLEASE READ SIGNAGE*

The Landfill's address is 3240 Berlin Drive. The diagram to the right illustrates the entrance to our facility (the landfill is the second right on Berlin Drive). The landfill entrance is equipped with inbound and outbound scales – all landfill customers must scale in and out. Department staff are available at the scale to direct you on disposal options and collection of payment.

For mailing, billing, and other departmental questions our office is located at 3200 Berlin Drive (first right on Berlin Drive) and parking is available on the south side of the building. We can also be reached at (608) 785-9572.

Curbside Trash

Trash will be picked up weekly on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday. Please refer to the map on page 3 to see your day of collection. Trash must be placed in the carts from Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling Service, Inc. These are the ONLY containers that are picked up. Carts have a 10-year warranty from the manufacturer. If they lose a wheel, the lid comes off, or other "normal" repairs, the cart will be repaired or exchanged by Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling Service, Inc. There is no cost to the resident for these types of "normal" repairs. **When you move, leave the cart at the residence. If you do not, actual replacement of the cart will be the full responsibility of the homeowner.**

Additional Trash

Trash set beside the cart, put out in bags, or a can will not be collected. You can wait and put the extra trash in the cart for the next collection, or haul yourself to the La Crosse County Landfill or Hilltopper. Both charge a small fee for disposal. If you intermittently have additional trash, you may purchase stickers from Hilltopper for additional bags of trash. These stickers will be paid for in advance, placed on the bag, and set next to your cart for pickup. If you find you need more than one cart, contact Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling at 783-6727 and make arrangements to have an additional cart delivered. There is an additional annual charge for the second cart. You will be billed directly by Hilltopper.

Placement of Carts

Place carts at least 3 feet away from obstacles including, but not limited to: other carts, recycling bins, mailboxes, power poles, etc. Place the cart within 2 feet of the surfaced edge of the road with the arrow on the cover pointing toward the road (wheels facing away from the road). Carts should be set out by 5 a.m. on collection day. Carts must be placed on a level surface with the covers reasonably shut for collection.



Trash Unacceptable to Place in Cart

Do not put grass, leaves, brush, recyclables, electronics, computer components, demolition or construction materials in the cart. Information on disposal of these items is contained in another part of this publication.

Recycling of Yard Waste, Branches, Brush & Christmas Trees, Large Items, Tires, Electronics, & Appliances

Yard Waste

Yard waste is not picked up as part of Holmen's refuse collection service, but the Village does provide a site where yard waste can be dropped off for recycling into compost. Our compost site is located on Empire Street about 2 blocks west of Holmen Drive, and it is open during spring, summer, and fall.

HOURS FOR 2020: Mondays, 2 p.m.–6 p.m. Wednesdays, 2 p.m.–6 p.m. Saturdays, 8 a.m.–4 p.m.

Village residents are allowed to take grass, weeds, leaves, sod, wood chips, garden waste, and soil to the compost site, and anyone is welcome to take finished compost and wood chips from the site. **No brush, branches, limbs, or twigs are accepted at the compost site, and no trash of any kind is accepted.**

Branches, Brush & Christmas Trees (on calendar)

The Village provides curbside brush chipping service beginning on the **first Monday of every month. If a holiday falls on the first Monday, the service will begin the following day. This service is not offered for construction sites, nor is it intended for the disposal of entire trees. This service is offered for tree and yard maintenance only, so disposal of entire trees should be arranged through a tree service contractor.** Have your brush and branches (up to 12 inches in diameter), including Christmas trees, stacked cut side out at the curb by 7 a.m. on that Monday morning, and the Village will chip them and haul them away. Be sure your branches and trees are free of dirt, metal, wire, rope, tinsel, plastic, stones, or other debris that could damage the chipper. **Your amount of brush and branches is limited to one pile per property no larger than 4 feet high X 4 feet wide X 8 feet long.** Flocked trees and stumps weighing less than 50 pounds will be picked up as large items on regularly scheduled large item pickup days. (See **Large Item Pickup** below.)

Large Item Pickup (on calendar)

Large items such as furniture, toilets, and carpet (tied in rolls that are no greater than 4 feet long or 60 pounds) are collected **every other Thursday by appointment only** (exception for Thanksgiving, collection will be the day after). Small amounts of lumber or similar waste securely tied in a bundle no longer than 4 feet and weighing no more than 60 pounds will also be collected at this time. The waste hauler will pick up no more than three 60-pound bundles annually from a residence. **Although there is no fee for pickup, you must call Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling, 783-6727 (toll free 888-783-6727), in advance with a list of items to be collected.**

Mattresses and box springs are collected at the curb on large item pickup day (fee applies). Call Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling to arrange for collection and payment. NOTE: Mattresses and box springs can be hauled to Hilltopper by resident for a lessor fee.

Tires (on calendar)

Tires **with rims removed** are collected at the curb on large item pickup day **every other Thursday by appointment only** (except for Thanksgiving, collection will be the day after) by calling Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling, 783-6727 (toll free 888-783-6727).

Electronics & Appliances Pickup (on calendar)

Appliances and electronics are collected **every Thursday by appointment only for a fee paid to Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling prior to collection** (exception for Thanksgiving, collection will be the day after). Electronics may also be delivered to Hilltopper Refuse and Recycling for a smaller recycling fee. Please call Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling, 783-6727 (toll free 888-783-6727), for pricing information.

Recyclables can be dropped off at Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling in Onalaska Monday–Saturday. Items accepted for recycling are cardboard, junk mail, magazines, glass bottles and jars, cartons, and tin cans. Aluminum cans are redeemed for cash. Trash, large items, and electronics may also be dropped off for a fee. Call 783-6727 for details.

Unacceptable Trash

Trash must be in trash cart
Loose trash will not be collected. Please read additional trash section for more information.

Remodeling and demolition materials

Items include, but are not limited to: roofing, plumbing, multiple windows, sheetrock, brick, concrete, asphalt, bathtubs, shower enclosures, and lumber. Please make arrangements with a private rubbish hauler for disposal of such material. For disposal of glass doors or windows, contact Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling at 783-6727 (toll free 888-783-6727).

Hazardous materials

Cleaners, solvents, gasoline, oil, or other toxic, corrosive, explosive, or highly combustible materials may not be placed in the regular trash. Refer to the reverse side for which hazardous materials are accepted at the La Crosse County Household Hazardous Materials Facility. If in question, call the facility for a recommendation at 608-785-9572.

Vehicle oil and batteries

Return to service stations or authorized dealers. A fee may be charged. Also accepted at La Crosse County Household Hazardous Materials Facility.

Vehicle parts

Vehicle parts and other metal weighing 10 pounds or more will not be collected. Take such items to a salvage yard.

2020 Holmen Trash & Recycling Pickup Schedule

Trash & Recycling Program (on calendar)

The Village of Holmen contracts with Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling of Onalaska to collect refuse and recyclables. Reference the calendar below for schedule. **Both trash and recyclables should be curbside by 5:00 a.m. and placed at least 3 feet apart.**

NOTE: Your regular pickup day will be delayed one day during the holiday weeks designated on the calendar below (except for Thanksgiving, collection will be the day after).

Guidelines for items to be placed in your recycling container are noted below. Recycling or other items are described on the opposite page.

Remember recycling is mandatory in the Village of Holmen. If in violation, items will be tagged and left at the collection site. Violators may also be fined.

Recycling Bin

The Village has provided each residence with a maroon recycling bin. If you do not have a Village of Holmen recycling bin, you may buy a replacement at the Village Hall. **If you move, the recycling bin should stay with the property.**

How to Prepare Recyclables

No need to sort or separate glass, tin cans, aluminum, plastic, or cartons. Place in recycling container together.

GLASS: Jars and bottles only!

Rinse clean. No need to remove label. **NO** light bulbs, dishes, glassware, or ceramics—put them in with regular trash.

TIN CANS: Empty food cans, empty paint cans, empty aerosol cans, bottle caps

Rinse food cans clean and remove labels. Remove the ends, place them in the can, and flatten. Remove lids from paint cans to show that they are empty. **NO** chemical cans, small appliances, or other scrap metal. Put them in with regular trash.

ALUMINUM: Cans only!

Drain liquid and rinse cans clean. Crushing is helpful. **NO** aluminum foil.

PLASTIC: #1 and #2 only!

Drain liquid and rinse clean.

CARTONS: Milk, juice, broth, soup, and other food and beverage cartons

What is a carton? It's a type of food and beverage packaging. There are two types: *shelf-stable* (broth, soup, soy milk, juice, milk, wine) and *refrigerated* (milk, juice, cream, egg substitutes). To prepare for recycling, drain liquid.


CORRUGATED CARDBOARD:

Breakdown and bundle in squares no larger than 4 feet X 4 feet. Place on top of or next to recycling bin, or inside cart. Keep dry! If snow or rain predicted, please put out following week. (Corrugated cardboard has two outer layers and a wavy inner layer. Do not confuse with soda and beer cartons, cereal boxes, etc. These are to be placed in trash.)

NOTE: Any and all cardboard should be flattened and tied, and be no larger than 4 feet X 4 feet. NO CARDBOARD BOXES SHOULD BE USED AS RECEPTACLES.

NEWSPAPERS (including inserts), MAGAZINES & PHONE BOOKS:

Bundle or place in a paper bag and put on top of or next to recycling bin, or inside cart. If inclement weather, please put out following week. No catalogs, junk mail, or flyers.



NOTE: Large Item, Tires, Electronics and Appliances are collected on designated Thursdays. Call Hilltopper Refuse & Recycling at 608-783-6727.

Household Hazardous Materials Facility (HHM)

Use is Free for La Crosse County, Wisconsin Residential Users (Unless Otherwise Noted Below)

Acceptable Materials

- Automotive fluids (oil, gas, etc.)
- Batteries (rechargeable, lead acid, lithium)
- Cell phones and digital cameras
- Cleaning products
- Computers (desktops, laptops, tablets)
- Computer equipment (printers, scanners, fax machines, keyboards, speakers, mice, hard drives)
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Lawn and garden chemicals (pesticides, herbicides, rodenticides, etc.)
- Mercury-containing devices (thermometers, thermostats, etc.)
- Microwaves and small Freon appliances **Fees Apply**
- Paint, stain, and varnish
- Pool chemicals
- Propane cylinders (handheld only)
- Sharp objects
- TVs and computer monitors **Fees Apply**
- Video devices (VCRs, DVD players, gaming consoles, cable receivers, etc.)

Unacceptable Materials

- Ammunition
- Black powder
- Compressed gas cylinders (other than handheld propane)
- Explosives
- Fireworks
- Radioactive materials
- Shock or heat-sensitive materials (peroxide, picric acid, etc.)

SAVE YOURSELF A TRIP!

These items can and should go into your regular curbside trash or recycling:

- Empty paint and aerosol cans (recycle)
- Alkaline batteries (trash)
- Dried out paint cans (trash)
- Incandescent & LED light bulbs (trash)

Residential users with more than 200 lbs. of material are encouraged to schedule an appointment.

Out-of-County residents are welcome to use the HHM on a fee basis.

FREE REUSE ROOM: Over 70,000 lbs. of usable household products are sorted and made available to the public in our ReUse Room annually. All items are free, but donations are appreciated. The ReUse Room is open during regular landfill office hours. The entrance to the ReUse Room is located on the east side of the landfill office building, right across from the HHM.

Safe Transportation of Hazardous Materials

1. Never mix chemicals.
2. Bring items in original containers or clearly mark contents. Tell attendant if you are unsure what is in a container.
3. Tighten all covers and lids.
4. Do not load waste materials in passenger area of vehicle.
5. Avoid spills. Put waste containers upright in a sturdy container and place securely in the trunk or back of a truck or van. *(All boxes or totes will be returned.)*
6. If container is leaking, pack it separately in a leak-proof pail or tub.
7. Gasoline should be transported in a designated red safety container.
8. Motor oil should be transported in a durable and leak-proof container labeled with the words "Used Oil."
9. Upon arrival, pull under the HHM canopy and remain in your vehicle with the engine shut off.
10. Do not co-mingle batteries with chemical waste. Tape the terminal ends of all batteries with clear tape to prevent arcing.

Sharps & Needles

Needles, syringes, auto-injectors (EpiPens), lancets, razor blades and other sharp objects must be brought to the HHM in puncture-resistant containers. Container options include a red sharps container or an appropriately labeled thick plastic laundry detergent bottle with screw on cap. No other containers will be accepted. Additional sharps collection sites can be found on the WDNR and MPCA websites.

Use By Businesses & Organizations

Many businesses, organizations, farms, orchards, in-home businesses, rental property owners, churches, schools, and municipalities generate small amounts of hazardous waste and are looking for an efficient means to dispose of such materials. Qualifying businesses can utilize the HHM on a fee basis. Prequalification for use is required. Visit our website to complete and submit the required forms.
